Drivers/loading staff trained in line with the Department of Transport's Code of Practice on load safety ii. Area where unit is to be loaded or unloaded should be clear of obstacles and pedestrians. iv. Lorry winch should be in good working order. v. Driver and crew should be wearing high visibility jackets and correct PPE	i. Owner should make event aware that a level and firm area is essential for unloading and loading shower units. ii. The driver should plan is journey/route to and from event before leaving.	Medium	High	Low
Hitching up trailer/shower units	Drivers and others may suffer serious crush injuries if trapped by moving trailer.	i. Drivers/loading staff to follow safe systems of work for hitching up the trailer. ii. Checks to ensure drivers follow safe system of work	Owner to ensure drivers are aware of safe systems of work. Manual handling - Lifting and moving heavy object or objects that are difficult to grasp.	Posh Wash employees risk injuries or back injury from handling heavy or awkward objects.	Operators should be trained in safe manual handling techniques:- bend from the knees, keep back straight, keep load close to the body at hip height. If an object is too heavy or awkward get another member of staff to help. Plan your route before you move heavy objects. Use sack truck or lifting equipment if necessary. Stability of the shower unit.	Posh Wash employees, event staff and general public may be harmed. Danger of crush injury due to moving shower unit.	i. When ever possible the shower units should be sited on firm level ground. ii. If the units cannot be sited on level ground then the most appropriate site should be used eg only a gently sloping area, not a steep gradient. iii Once positioned the unit should be levelled. iv Blocks used to support the units should be fit for purpose. v All four-jack legs should be secure and in good working order. vi. Units hand brake should be on. vii. Jockey wheel functioning	The crew member responsible for sitting the units should run through the 'shower unit check list' before leaving the yard to ensure complete and relevant tool kit is taken to the event. Level shower unit – trips	Posh Wash employees, event staff and general public may be harmed. There is a danger of tripping if unit is sited incorrectly.	Use a spirit level both horizontally and vertically on the unit to confirm that it has been sited correctly .Make sure area around shower block free from any trip hazard	The crew member responsible for sitting the units should run through the 'shower unit check list' before leaving the yard to ensure complete and relevant tool kit is taken to the event. Level shower unit - slips	Posh Wash employees, event staff and general public may be harmed. Water will not drain properly and floor may be have excessive puddles which would be a slip hazard	Mop up any water that may cause a slip hazard. Use floor scraper Level unit correctly. Boiler room - Fire	Posh Wash employees, event staff and general public may be at risk of burns if a fire breaks out in the boiler room	No flammable chemicals (cleaning products) or excessive amounts of blue roll to be stored in boiler room. If a small fire does break out & it is safe to do so use a dry powder extinguisher to put out the fire. In the case of large fire do not attempt to control the fire. Contact emergency services and let them know that LPG is present. Fire extinguisher fitted to boiler room wall	Responsible person to carry out weekly check of boiler room to make sure it fit for purpose. Fire risk assessment has been done, and any necessary action taken, see www.gov.uk/workplace-fire-safety-your-responsibilities	Medium	High	low

LPG Gas bottle installation and use.	Posh wash employees, event staff and general public.	Standards of installation and use of gas to be adhered to as set out by the GSIUR (Gas Safety (Installation & Use) Regulations Act 1998.	A responsible employee with relevant experience and training to connect gas bottle. Owner to ensure staff have correct tools.			
Explosion	Posh wash employee, event staff and general public.	Gas bottles should be in an upright position. No public access to areas where gas bottles are stored or installed When the gas bottles are not connected to a unit plastic caps or plugs should be in place in the cylinder valve. This applies even if the gas bottle is deemed 'empty'. A 9kg dry powder fire extinguisher stored in the boiler room of each shower unit.	Trained responsible member of staff to ensure that Posh Wash employees are vigilant regarding safe use and installation of lpg gas. No smoking signs put by gas connections.			
Gas leak	Posh wash employee, event staff and general public.	If there is a gas leak any source of ignition in the near vicinity should be extinguished. If possible the bottle should be moved to a well ventilated area. Bottle should be positioned so that the leak is upper most The gas bottle should be well signed 'no sources of ignition' Gas is heavier than air so will settle on the ground if in an enclosed space. A small amount of gas can mix with air and create a large flammable volume which could ignite.	To inspect for leaks the following can be done: use sense of smell listen for leaks apply soap solution on suspect area – look for bubbles in soap. Condensation or frost around the leak area. NEVER use a naked flame or source of ignition.
